NEW to Evaluations and Team Formation Policy

Proposed Wording:

U11 & U13 Goalie Evaluations

Goalie Evaluations scores will consist of 5 skates. The 5 skates are as follows:

- 2 mandatory goalie specific skills sessions, held before any tiered evaluations.
- 2 skates and 1 intersquad game during tiered evaluations.
- The content of skills evaluations will be determined by the independent evaluators, subject to the approval of the MMHA board.
- For Gold evaluations, the score of all 5 skates will be used for goalie placement on the Gold team only.
- For Silver and Bronze tiered evaluations, only the scores of the Goalie specific skills session will be carried forward. The scores from the additional 3 skates in Silver and Bronze evaluations will be added to the goalie skills session scores to form a new total to be used for team placement
- If the MMHA is short a goalie at the U11 or U13 level, the MMHA reserves the right to invite out of Association goalies to any tiered evaluations, so every team can roster a goalie.

U15 & U18 Goalie Evaluations:

Goalie Evaluations scores will consist of 5 skates. The 5 skates are as follows:

- 2 mandatory goalie specific skills sessions, held before any tiered evaluations.
- 2 skates and 1 intersquad game during tiered evaluations.
- If the MMHA is short a goalie at the U15 or U18 level, the MMHA reserves the right to invite out of Association goalies to any tiered evaluations, so every team can roster a goalie.
- Should MMHA only have enough goalies for the projected rostered teams, MMHA reserves the right to cancel the 2 mandatory goalie specific skill sessions.

Rationale for Change:

In 23/24 MMHA implemented a new Gold Tryout policy for our U11 & U13 age divisions as well as a new U15 Tiered program.

After the initial evaluations MMHA received feedback from the membership that indicated the process for goalie evaluations was not clearly laid out prior to the start of the process.

The MMHA board reviewed the Evaluations and Team Formation Policy, and noted that there was no detail included in the current policy that explained the process for goalies. This addition to the Evaluations and Team Formation Policy is intended to address that shortcoming.
