

Kennworth Softball FAQ

General Questions

What is the time commitment for players?

Practices and games are at minimum once a week for all levels.

Practice:

Day and time are determined by each coach. Typically, they are at or after 6:00PM.

Teams can still have practice if there is inclement weather, we utilize D-BAT in Kennesaw for indoor practice as needed.

Games:

Games are usually once a week on a Saturday. Time and day of the week can change based on the team level and field availability.

The organization does their best to match Cobb County school break schedules.

What equipment do I need for my player?

Helmet with cage, bat, fielding mask and cleats. Balls for practice and games will be provided. If your player is in a special position or needs additional equipment, please reach out to your coach.

What does my registration fee cover?

Registration fees cover team jerseys, field maintenance and equipment, umpire fees, game balls, and administrative fees.

Will all games be played at Kennworth Park?

Most games will be played at Kennworth Park; however, we partner with Kennesaw Baseball & Softball Association and will play some games at Adams Park in Kennesaw, Rhyne Park in Smyrna and Hurt Road Park in Austell. Those games will be noted in the game schedule.

Are there try outs?

Each level has an Open Work Out Assessment prior to the season starting. While this is not a formal try out, this allows our coaches to evaluate players skill levels to appropriately draft players to teams.

Parent/Guardian Involvement

What is the time commitment for parents/guardians?

Parents/guardians are not required to participate in anything. However, we offer many volunteer opportunities! Field Clean Up Day, working the concession stand, or participating on our board.

While you are not required to work the concession stand, we offer a waived bond for all families who volunteer their time.

Can I coach?

Yes! Each team needs ONE head coach and at least ONE assistant coach

Coaches must attend practices and games – must pass a background check – if you are unable to make a practice or game you must find coverage with the assistant coaches - practice structure is determined by each coach

I don't want to coach but I want to help, is there anything I can do?

Yes! Team Parent is for you! Team parents help in many ways! Organize the equipment, get the players ready for the batting line up, determine the snack schedule, help lead a team cheer, and keep the players focused and motivated. Anyone can be a team parent, and they are highly encouraged for our younger teams. Interested? Talk to your coach!
