Programs: Trainees

Introduce athletes to Artistic Swimming, allow families to assess the sport, and determine the right next steps (Intermediate or Age Group)

- Practice Twice Per Week
- Month-to-month membership
- Land and Water Training
- 4-6 months before moving to intermediate
 Ages 7+ Athlete must know how to swim



Programs: Intermediate

First level of competitive swimming for Athletes, allowing competition at local NW events.

- Practice three times per week
- Land and Water Training
- Skills Level Testing
- Seasonal membership
- Placed after September registration
- Local meets



Programs: Age Group

Provides Opportunities for Junior (15+), Youth(13-15), and u12 (8-12) competitive swimming. Team structure dependent on registered athletes for the season.

- Practice three to four times per week
- Land and Water Training
- Skills Level Testing (dependent on coach)
- Seasonal membership
- Placed after September registration
- Local meets
 - One zone meet
 - Two national qualifier opportunities



Coaching Plans

The club is starting with part-time coaching staff. Our goal is to bring full time national level coaching to the club.

- Trainees: Coach confirmed and are working through the hiring process.
- Intermediate: Have reached out to prior coaches in the area for support.

Age Group: Coach confirmed and are working through hiring process.

We are working to bring Carolina De Soto on as head coach.

Pools

We will make use of multiple different facilities and have made excellent progress.

Trainees will be consistent at one facility in the Beaverton area.

Intermediate/Age Group: Weekday practices are planned to be in the Portland/metro area, but there will be one weekly 4-hour Saturday practice in Silverton.

We will confirm pool locations as soon as we have completed signed pool commitments.



Costs: General Note

This is the first year of the clubs existence and while we plan for fundraising to help the club in the future, this first year we will need to rely on dues and some of the early donations we have received. We can share estimated cost right now as we gain a better understanding of membership numbers expected.

OEAS has submitted the 1023 form to start 501(c) not-for profit status. This is important as it will make the organization more cost effective in the future as we can take advantage of administrative discounts and fundraising benefits. We expect this to take 3-12 months (we did not pay the expedite fee).

Costs: Programs

Trainees: Between \$250 and \$300 per month. This will cover two practices per week, pool rental time, and coaching.

Intermediate: Between \$3,500 or \$4,500 for the season. This will cover 3 practices per week, pool rental time, and coaching.

Age Group: Between \$4,000 and \$5,000 for the seasons. This will cover 4 practices per week, pool rental time, and coaching.

Costs: Gear

Gear: Base gear which is required for practice and competition (excluded competition suite) we expect to be around \$200. This does not include additional items like Parka, pants, Bag, or competition suite (\$100-\$200).

While we would like athletes to get a branded bag for the club we will be flexible as we work together to focus our dollars on coaching and pool access.

Costs: Meets

Meets: There will be an independent registration fee billed to each member for meets. These are typically \$35 per athlete for local meets. We are working on travel policies and we will engage with members once we have registration complete.
