



Code of Conduct

The Tyrol Basin Ski Team is dedicated to promoting ski racing through healthy competition, teamwork, respect, and personal growth. This Code of Conduct outlines expectations for all participants—athletes, coaches, parents/guardians, and officials—to ensure a positive, safe, and supportive environment.

SECTION 1: Athlete Responsibilities

1. Respect

- Treat teammates, coaches, competitors, officials, spectators, and all Tyrol Basin facilities with respect at all times.
- Use appropriate language and behavior on and off the hill.

2. Sportsmanship

- Demonstrate integrity, humility, and fairness in both victory and defeat.
- Support teammates and encourage a positive team atmosphere.

3. Effort & Commitment

- Arrive prepared and ready to give your best effort during all practices, races, and team events.
- Participate fully, stay focused, and commit to your personal development and team goals.

4. Learning & Coachability

- Be open to feedback and instruction from coaches.



- Show a willingness to learn, improve skills, and take responsibility for your growth.

5. Health & Safety

- Follow all ski area rules and safety protocols.
 - Avoid dangerous or reckless behavior that could harm yourself or others.
 - Immediately inform a coach of any injury, illness, or equipment concern.
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SECTION 2: Parent & Guardian Expectations

To support a healthy team environment, parents and guardians agree to:

- Encourage good sportsmanship by modeling positive behavior.
 - Respect coaches, officials, athletes, and other families.
 - Allow coaches to coach—avoid sideline coaching or undermining team decisions.
 - Communicate concerns privately and respectfully with coaches or team leadership.
 - Support attendance, punctuality, and athlete readiness for practices and races.
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SECTION 3: Coach Responsibilities

TBST coaches commit to:

- Provide a safe, structured, and positive learning environment.
- Teach skills, sportsmanship, and teamwork with fairness and respect.
- Communicate expectations clearly to athletes and parents.



- Serve as role models in conduct, professionalism, and decision-making.
 - Address conflicts, safety issues, and misconduct promptly and appropriately.
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SECTION 4: Enforcement & Consequences

TBST reserves the right to take disciplinary action when behavior violates this Code of Conduct. Consequences for athlete misconduct follow a progressive model unless the severity of the behavior requires immediate escalation.

Athlete Infractions

1. First Infraction

- Verbal Warning; parent/guardian will be notified.

2. Second Infraction

- Athlete will be removed from practice or competition; parent/guardian will be notified.

3. Third Infraction

- Athlete will be suspended from all team activities for the remainder of the season.

Severe Misconduct Clause:

Actions involving harassment, discrimination, violence, substance use, or severe safety risk may result in immediate suspension or removal from the team regardless of infraction count.
