

USSSA Bat Mark Rules for BEESA

(File last updated June 2022)

Bats must either:

- Have the new permanent (1) USSSA Mark on its taper OR
- Be a Wood Bat (2)

Note, bats manufactured after Jan 2021 will feature a new stamp, but those with the previous stamp are grandfathered in as acceptable. See below for the two acceptable bat stamp styles.

* Bats which meet these rules will be allowed in BEESA play, unless the bat is listed on the USSSA Withdrawn/Non-Compliant Bats List (found under Licensed Equipment – New Bat Rules section of the USSSA Baseball website) as a bat withdrawn by the manufacturer or found by USSSA to be non-compliant.

(1) USSSA marks and other graphics of the bat must be applied permanently and must be applied by the USSSA licensed manufacturer. No stickers or decals are allowed and no one may add graphics to a bat once manufactured.

(2) Wood bats must have be 2 1/4" or less in diameter and note that it is for softball with wordings like "Softball", "Official Softball", etc. This is different from official USSSA bat rules which do not require such wording, but BEESA will enforce for ease of verification of bat by umpires.
