Treasurer's Report

The bank account for the Redwing Zone is ending the year in a good position with a balance totalling approximately \$275,000 which is up from \$230,000 at this time last year. A healthy bank balance ensures the Redwings will not need to increase registration fees and stay in line with the other zones while maintaining team sizes at levels which are good for player development. Although there were a few registration fees that were paid later than the September 1st due date. All registration fees have been paid in full with no outstanding fees due. Year-to-date revenue as of March 31st, 2026 (\$452,239) was virtually the same as of March 2025 (\$455,221) and although lower than budgeted, additional bingo revenue will be realized by the June 30th year end. Expenses for the year are tracking to be less than budgeted. There were some variations in expense line items but the majority have come in at or less than budgeted. YTD Surplus is currently \$31,062 vs budget of \$27,466.

Bingo Income/Grants includes grant cheques from SLGA for the bingos as well as any funds transferred from the Bingo Account. Bingo credits earned working during the 25/26 season can be used to pay registration fees (and team fees) for the 26/27 hockey season. Credits are applied once players are registered for the hockey season. Credits cannot be paid out if not used but could be transferred to another family. 15 teams took advantage of the \$350/team for goalie development. If families are in need of financial assistance for the following hockey season, they should look at applying for assistance as soon as they register their players for hockey. KidSport, JumpStart and Lace Em Up are just a few of the organizations that will support families need financial assistance for their player's registration fees. Please accept my report as read.

Registrar's Report

First off, a big "Thank you" to all of the Executive members for their patience with me during my first year as Registrar. The Help and Guidance I received was greatly appreciated. Secondly, a shout out to congratulate all the winning Redwing teams from this season. It's really awesome to see so many banners going home. It just shows the dedication, commitment and hard work that our kids, coaches and support staff put in every year.

The 2025-26 Season had a total of 479 participants across all age groups. This total includes the city-wide leagues for U15A and as well all AA for U13 through to U18. A total of 417 participants played on Redwing or a Redwing Hybrid team and the remaining 62 were on city-wide teams at various age groups.

We did see a slight increase in registration numbers at the U7 age group, as compared to last season. That is great news to move into next season with. Overall the registration numbers are slightly down but only by a small margin. All in all, they are quite comparable to the 2024-25 season.

Manager Coordinator Report

This season we went back to an in person coach/manager meeting that was held at Centennial Collegiate in the Library. We had either a coach or a manager attend for about 1/2 of our Redwings teams. The meeting was well received and I would recommend continuing having an in person meeting at the beginning of the season. After the meeting I sent out the manager package electronically. I attend all the SMHA age group manager meetings and had a number of new Redwing managers come and introduce themselves to me at those meetings. The online criminal record check process continued to present some challenges this year. We had 16 coaches miss the submission deadline. The coaches that required RCMP criminal record checks due to living outside of Saskatoon city limits experienced some challenges getting their results back quickly. Some had to wait up to 14 days, which was a contributing factor in some of our late submissions.

I collected preliminary team budget in the fall. This season I had a number of teams who did not submit preliminary budgets despite a number of reminders. Final budgets are still coming in. I have about 1/2 of the final budgets currently and will continue to collect them. I will follow up with all teams until all the final budgets are collected. Goalie Coordinator Report

Overall the season went smooth. The Redwings Zone hosted 6 try goalie days ran by Focus. We targeted U9 and U11 with these, a lot of the U9 kids don't have goalie gear so I was able to borrow gear from SMHA. There was a lot of interest with 22 kids in total getting to try it at least once and most got 2 or 3 sessions. We split the costs with the Renegade zone, so each zone had room for 8 kids per day. SMHA also hosted a try goalie days ran, we had a very good showing from the Redwings Zone on that as well.

During evaluations SMHA was in constant contact with all goalie coordinators to attempt to make sure all zones had sufficient goaltenders for their number of teams and tiers. In the end, the only move that our Zone made was one Redwing U13 goalie getting exported to the Aces Zone. Of the 17 teams eligible for Redwing Zone goalie credits (\$350), 13 were claimed. I contacted the remaining 4 again last week, unlikely they will be paid out. Please accept my report as read.

We both still sent out all our information digitally so that teams had access if they could not attend the meeting. At the meeting, I tried to stress the importance of coaches understanding what qualifications are needed for all coaching positions at all levels to make sure we have coaches with the proper certifications on the bench for the December deadline. This was the second year of the online CRC form and application process and there still seemed to be difficulties for some coaches to complete the process before the November deadline. I answer numerous questions throughout the year from coaches, but the certifications and affiliates continue to be the off-ice duties that coaches still need the most support in understanding.

I want to commend our coaches for being on top of the certifications and clinics that are required for each registered official on the team roster. With some gentle reminders, coaches were able to stay on top of their teams and because of this we were able to meet all team and individual requirements and received ZERO fines from SHA for, I believe, the fourth consecutive year. I would encourage all coaches to continue to stay up to date with their certifications as their players move up into older age groups. With almost all clinics moving fully online it is easy to work your way through them at any time of the year and be fully certified for the next level prior to the season starting.

This will be my last year as an executive member, and I will be stepping down from the Coach Mentor position. I want to thank all the board members- past and present, as it has been a pleasure being a part of this executive for the last 10ish years. Please accept my report as read.

Bingo Coordinator

With the role again not being filled at the AGM in 2025, I volunteered to continue in the role of Redwing Bingo Coordinator for 2025-2026. This was my third year in the role, and as our family is no longer active in minor hockey, we will need a new volunteer to take on this position for the 2026–2027 season. I am happy to support a transition. The Wild Zone Coordinator is also in her final term, and their zone has identified a volunteer who will step into the role next season.

City Centre Bingo continues to assign bingos quarterly, and we share all assigned dates with the Wild Zone. We have maintained a strong working relationship, splitting bingos evenly and coordinating through a shared tracking spreadsheet. This has helped ensure coverage and accountability. We continue to follow a consistent process: bingo dates are posted to the website and shared with regular workers, with reminder emails sent leading up to each shift. Paperwork from each bingo is collected and provided to the treasurer along with payout information. A few new families have signed up to work bingos, and many long-standing volunteers continue to support consistently. Attendance has remained strong, and we have had very few issues with missed shifts.

An important update this year is the increase in bingo payouts. The amount per bingo session has increased to up to \$150 per shift, compared to up to \$115 previously, and this increase has been applied retroactively to sessions worked earlier in the 2025–2026 season. This provides a meaningful benefit to families and strengthens the value of participation. City Centre Bingo has experienced some operational changes this year, including operating without a General Manager and some staffing turnover. Despite this, bingo operations have continued. We have also benefited from strong support from the City Centre Bingo Board. A board member has assisted by covering bingos when neither the Wild Coordinator nor I are available to attend. This has been especially important, as we both work full-time and are often unavailable for weekday shifts, and weekends can be challenging due to hockey and other sport commitments. It remains important that Redwings continue participating as a charity with City Centre Bingo. Ongoing participation ensures we remain eligible for monthly payments to our gaming account. Maintaining volunteer capacity is critical to sustaining this revenue stream.

Bingos for the upcoming June–September period are expected to be assigned shortly and will be communicated once received. In closing, I would encourage any interested family to consider taking on the Bingo Coordinator role. It is a manageable position with established processes and strong collaboration with the Wild Zone. Ensuring a smooth transition this year will be important to maintaining our bingo operations and the financial benefits they provide to Redwing families. I want to thank members of the Redwing board for their support of bingos with communication, payouts, and other logistics. I also want to thank the Redwing families who volunteer to work bingos. They are a wonderful team of people who have fun while working and represent our zone well. I have truly enjoyed working bingos over the past 15 years and getting to know many hockey families. Please accept my report as read.
