INDOOR LEAGUE STRUCTURE

- 1.1 League structure will be determined on the number of teams entering the SCCVL before the Preseason Meeting in October.
 - 1.1.1 The league structure will either be:
 - 1.1.1.1 The Division/Region Format.
 - 1.1.1.2 The Work Up/Down Format.
- 1.2 For the Division/Region Format, the teams will be divided into different divisions and regions.
 - 1.2.1 The regions will be based off of:
 - 1.2.1.1 Geographic location.
 - 1.2.1.2 Intention to go to the NCVF National Tournament.
 - 1.2.1.3 Previous year's finish at SCCVL Championship Tournament, NCVF National Tournament, and Fall Classic of the current academic year.
 - 1.2.1.4 History of program.
 - 1.2.1.5 New program.
 - 1.2.1.6 All schools on probation will move to Division 2 or Division 3 unless waived by the commissioner.
- 1.3 For the Work Up/Down Format, all the teams will be lumped together in one division (Men's or Women's) and will play three weekends. After each weekend, teams will either move up, stay, or move down a pool.
 - 1.3.1 In order to move up a pool, a team must:
 - 1.3.1.1 Finish 1st or 2nd in their pool.
 - 1.3.1.2 Win their crossover match.
 - 1.3.2 To move down a pool, a team will:
 - 1.3.2.1 Finish 3rd or 4th in their pool.
 - 1.3.2.2 Lose their crossover match.
 - 1.3.3 If a team loses their crossover match after finishing 1st or 2nd, or wins their crossover after finishing 3rd or 4th, they will stay in their pool.
- 1.4 The league will be structured with a variation of double round robin league regional, home and away, and/or crossover league tournaments based on the number of divisions and regions each season.
- 1.5 The official opening date for league matches will be any time after January 1st of the upcoming year.

SCCVL INDOOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 2.1 In each of the Men's & Women's divisions, the SCCVL Championships will have 18-24 teams each.
 - 2.1.1 For the Division/Region Format, the top 6 or 8 teams from each division will qualify.
 - 2.1.2 For the Work Up/Down Format, the top 18 teams from each division will qualify.
- 2.1.3 SCCVL Commissioners will have the ability to make any adjustments needed to accommodate the best quality of competition and logistics for the league championships.
- 2.2 The format for all divisions will be a round of pool play with a single elimination playoff bracket. Matches will be played on a selected weekend in March or April.
- 2.3 All times and sites must be approved by the League Commissioner, Co-Commissioners, and/or Men's and Women's Liaisons.

- 2.4 The League Commissioners will coordinate the process of match sites, dates, times, officials, and other administrative duties. The respective League Liaison will resolve any conflicts.
- 2.5 The SCCVL Championships is a function of the entire league. The League Commissioners will run Championships.
- 2.6 In the event of a tie between two teams for a spot in the SCCVL Championship, the final team will be determined by the following tiebreaker rules:
 - 2.6.1 Matches against each other.
 - 2.6.2 Sets against each other.
 - 2.6.3 Points scored against each other.
 - 2.6.4 Points scored for and against in all league matches.
- 2.7 In the event of a tie between three teams for a spot in the SCCVL Championship, the final team will be determined by the following tiebreaker rules:
 - 2.7.1 Sets against each other.
 - 2.7.2 Points scored against each other.
 - 2.7.3 Points scored for and against in all league matches. Updated as of 12/27/2023.
- 2.8 If it is a 2-way tie but BOTH would make the playoffs, to determine seeding into the playoffs, head to head record will determine seeding. If the head to head record is the same, set percentage will be used, and then point percentage. If the point percentage is the same, a coin will be flipped.
- 2.9 If it is a 2-way tie but could eliminate a team, to determine the final spot will be based on head to head record if the two teams have played each other. If teams have not played each other, their win/loss record against common opponents will determine who is seeded higher. If that record is the same, then the set percentage against common opponents will determine who advances. If the set percentage is the same, point percentage will be used. If the point percentage is the same, a coin will be flipped.
- 2.10 If it is a 3-way tie but all would make playoffs, to determine seeding into the playoffs, head to head record will determine seeding. If the head to head record is the same, set percentage will be used, and then point percentage. If the point percentage is the same, a coin will be flipped. If teams have no head to head record, overall set percentage, then point percentage will be used to determine seeding.
- 2.11 If it is a 3-way tie and 1 or 2 teams would not make it in, head to head record will determine seeding. If the head to head record is the same, set percentage will be used, and then point percentage. If the point percentage is the same, a coin will be flipped. If teams have no head to head record, overall set percentage, then point percentage will be used to determine seeding.
- 2.12 For any 3 way tie in which there is an in-balanced head to head match up (i.e. two teams played each other but the third team did not play either of the two teams, or one team played both the other teams involved in the tiebreaker but the other two only played one of the teams involved in the tiebreaker), results from common opponents will be taken into consideration with match percentage, set percentage, point percentage, and then a coin flip.

COLLEGIATE BEACH VOLLEYBALL TOUR STRUCTURE

3.1 The Collegiate Beach Volleyball Tour (CBVT) structure will be determined by the commissioners based on the number of qualifying tournaments available preceding the CBVT Championships.

- 3.2 An Open tournament on the CBVT will have at least one round of pool play followed by a single elimination playoff bracket to determine an event champion.
- 3.3 For the CBVT League Structure, there will be set regions, at least 2 or 3.
- 3.3.1 Each region will play themselves in a regional, then 1 to 2 crossovers depending on the number of set regions each season.
- 3.4 Participants in the CBVT do not have to be registered athletes in the SCCVL indoor league.
 - 3.4.1 Participants must, however, be enrolled college students with a valid student ID and number.
- 3.5 Partners in a tournament must represent the same academic institution.
- 3.6 Varsity status athletes
- 3.6.1 Current Year Varsity Players The CBVT & NCVF Beach Championships will take place prior to the NCAA Beach Volleyball Season. As such, players that were listed on a Varsity roster in the spring of the same calendar year (prior academic year) will be eligible as Former Varsity Players IF they have been removed from the Varsity roster prior to the NCVF Beach Championships or their Varsity coach has emailed the NCVF Compliance Chair confirming that they are no longer participating as a member of the Varsity team.
- 3.6.2 Former Varsity Players NCVF Governance Rules 4.3 and 4.5 will remain in effect, with Rule 4.5 being updated to limit each pair to 1 Former Varsity Player.

CBVT CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 4.1 In order to participate in the CBVT Championships, top 6 universities based on overall results from league play will qualify for the CBVT Championships.
- 4.2 The CBVT Championships will have at least one round of pool play followed by a single elimination playoff bracket to determine the Tour Champions.
 - 4.2.1 There will be a pairs champion and a team champion.
 - 4.2.1.1 The pairs champion will be the winner of the gold bracket playoffs.
 - 4.2.1.2 The team champion will be determined by the team with the highest amount of points accumulated based finishes at the championships will be taken into account when calculating the points earned for each school.

COMMISSIONER'S DUTIES

- 5.1 The League Commissioner has the right to decide anything not defined in the constitution.
- 5.2 The League Commissioner may have the input and suggestions of the co-commissioners, but will have the final say in any and all disputes or decisions.
- 5.3 The League Commissioner and co-commissioners will oversee league standings and match results from coaches or team representatives on a weekly basis once the regular league season commences. All results and standings will be posted to www.sccvl.org.
- 5.4 The League Commissioners will organize each division's regional tournaments, crossover tournament, and SCCVL championship.
- 5.5 The League Commissioners will provide and pay for the R1 official for all indoor tournaments; regional, crossovers, and SCCVL Championship.

- 5.6 The League Commissioners will provide league awards purchased from league fees.
- 5.7 The League Commissioners will have the authority to set disciplinary actions. This includes, but is not limited to, punishing players or teams whose activities reflect negatively upon the SCCVL.
- 5.8 The League Commissioner has the authority to amend the constitution at the end of each year to update, revise, and revisit as needed based on input from coaches, players, team presidents, sponsors, refs, and other league liaisons.
- 5.8.1 If, at any point during the competitive season, any rules, policies, procedures, or other protocol within the league execution need to be revised or revisited, the commissioners have the ability to collaborate and make appropriate changes based on a case by case basis.

INDOOR OFFICIAL RULES

6.1 For all indoor SCCVL events, the 2015-2017 Domestic Competition Regulations ("DCR") as presented by the NCVF and USA Volleyball are in effect. The main emphasis of those rules and modifications are listed below as well as a link to the published rules.

USAV Indoor Rule Book

- 6.1.1 All non-deciding sets will be rally-score to 25 points, and 15 points in all deciding sets. Matches may be best of 5 or best of 3 sets.
- 6.1.2 Libero Player Will be used as outlined in the DCR. The DCR states there must be a rally between two libero replacements. To allow the libero to serve, an exception will be made to this rule. The DCR is modified to allow the libero to serve in one position designated for the set. The libero is not required to sit out a rally between replacements when the next action the libero takes is to serve.
 - 6.1.3 The league cross-over/mini tournament will be best of 3 sets.
 - 6.1.4 The winner of the coin toss will have the choice of serve only.
- 6.1.5 The home team shall designate its home bench area prior to the entrance of the visitors. This protocol will be standard for all single league matches.
- 6.1.6 The recommended ball is the Molten Red/White/Blue V58L-3 Pro Touch for men and the Molten Red/White/Blue IV58L-3 Super Touch for women.
 - 6.1.7 The playing uniform rule will be given special attention as outlined in the DCR.
- 6.1.8 The official warm-up will begin 11 minutes prior to the match with the playing court set up 30 minutes before the first serve of the match.
 - 6.1.9 For the first match of each team for the tournament, warm up will proceed as follows:
 - 6.1.9.1 The two teams share the court with no hitting for a maximum of 5 minutes up until 9 minutes before the match
 - 6.1.9.2 The second 4 minutes belong to the visiting team. (Minutes 9:00-5:00)
 - 6.1.9.3 The third 4 minutes belong to the home team. (Minutes 5:00-4:00)
 - 6.1.9.4 The last minute belongs to both teams to prepare for final instructions. (Minutes 1:00-0:00)
 - 6.1.9.5 Teams playing their other matches of the day will each receive 4 minutes for hitting.
 - 6.1.10 The home team must provide the game ball.

CBVT BEACH OFFICIAL RULES

7.1 For all CBVT events, the 2015-2017 Domestic Competition Regulations ("DCR") as presented by the NCAA and USA Volleyball are in effect. The main emphasis of those rules and modifications are listed below as well as a link to the published rules.

- 7.1.1 All non-deciding sets will be rally score to 21 points and 15 points in all deciding sets
- 7.1.2 The tour pool play matches may be 1 set to 28 for 4 team pools or 1 set to 21 for 5 team pools.
- 7.1.3 The winner of the roshambo will have the choice of side or serve.
- 7.1.4 The recommended ball will be provided by the CBVT Tournament Director.
- 7.1.5 The official warm-up will begin 5 minutes prior to the match.
 - 7.1.5.1 The two teams share the court with shared hitting for 5 minutes maximum.
- 7.1.6 The officiating team must be 5 feet away from one of the poles on the court they are reffing.
 - 7.1.6.1 The referees shall get up to look at ball marks to help with in/out ball decisions, if called for.
 - 7.1.6.2 The players have the responsibility to make "honor" calls on themselves in regard to a net touch or a touch while blocking the ball. The referee should also make these calls.
 - 7.1.6.3 The referee shall be responsible for keeping the score of the game.
 - 7.1.6.4 The referee shall properly record the information on the pool sheet (if pool play). This includes updating the standings and recording the score.
 - 7.1.6.5 In the playoff rounds, the losing team MUST stay and ref.

CODE OF CONDUCT

- 8.1 Players participating in the SCCVL assume a responsibility to conduct themselves and their team in a manner fitting with their school's purpose as a post-secondary educational institution. Players are expected to act in a mature and responsible manner when participating in all SCCVL events.
- 8.2 By participating in SCCVL events, participants acknowledge that they are representatives to the sport of volleyball, both on and off the court. Therefore; participants will abide by the highest sportsmanship and ethical standards of conduct.
- 8.3 Any reports (from other teams, law enforcement, spectators, and/or hotel management) of activities that reflect negatively upon the SCCVL may result in punishments.
- 8.4 When participating in any SCCVL event, players and teams must comply with all applicable policies and rules set forth by their schools and beaches.
- 8.5 All participants will conduct themselves with honor and dignity. This includes playing volleyball for the game's sake, being well mannered in a win or loss, working for the good of the team, and supporting the efforts of teammates and opponents.
- 8.6 Participants will not:
 - 8.6.1 Consume, distribute, or possess alcohol while participating in any SCCVL event. State laws prohibit the use of alcohol by anyone under the age of twenty-one.
 - 8.6.2 Attend any SCCVL event while intoxicated.
 - 8.6.3 Consume, distribute, or possess drugs that are a violation of federal or state laws.
 - 8.6.4 Any person found in violation may be subject to prosecution by law enforcement.
 - 8.6.5 Inappropriately taunt or physically confront any participant or other person at any SCCVL event.
 - 8.6.6 Damage or destroy any facilities or personal property of others at any SCCVL event.
 - 8.6.7 Violate facility or hotel rules or policies.
 - 8.6.8 Violate any federal, state, or local laws while at an SCCVL event.

- 8.7 It is the responsibility of the team representative to review this section with his/her team and participants.
- 8.8 By participating, participants acknowledge that there are inherent risks associated with attending or playing in any SCCVL event, including but not limited to, risk of injury, including bone, muscular or nerve damage, loss of or damage to personal property, death, and other potential losses or damages.
- 8.9 Participants assume liability for injuries or damages in connection with their individual or joint participation in any SCCVL event.
- 8.10 Campuses who are hosting are responsible for the conduct and behaviors of their spectators and players.
 8.10.1 Any reports of poor conduct, misbehavior, or disrespectful actions from either the players, spectators, coaches, athletic administration, or anyone else involved with the match will suffer consequences issued by the league commissioner.
- 8.11 The league commissioner will consult with the other league liaisons, as well as all the parties involved in the reports to determine a just and proper punishment.
- 8.12 All athletes, coaches, staff members, managers, spectators, and/or any individuals in attendance at any sanctioned SCCVL or CBVT events shall refrain from theft or stealing. Theft refers to the unauthorized use or misappropriation of the SCCVL or participating university programs, athletes, fan's property or assets by anyone in attendance. This includes, but is not limited to, stealing cash, merchandise, supplies, equipment, or intellectual property. Event theft can also involve fraudulent activities, such as falsifying score sheets or using SCCVL resources for personal gain.
 - 8.12.1 If you suspect an instance of anyone violating the code of conduct please report it immediately to an SCCVL official via email or text. All reports will be treated confidentially and investigated promptly.
 - 8.12.2 Investigation Procedure: All allegations of violations of the code of conduct will be investigated thoroughly and fairly. The investigation process may include:
 - 8.12.2.1 Interviews with witnesses and the accused person or group
 - 8.12.2.2 Review of relevant documentation, such as any material records or security footage
 - 8.12.2.3 Collection and preservation of evidence
 - 8.12.2.4 A thorough review of the facts to determine whether there is sufficient evidence to support the allegations

RESPONSIBILITY FOR COMPLETION OF LEAGUE SCHEDULE & POST-SEASON PLAY

- 9.1 Each team is responsible for completing their season schedule.
- 9.2 An indoor season schedule for the Division/Region Format consist of:
 - 9.2.1 1 Regional Tournament against all teams in respective regions.
 - 9.2.2 2 Crossover Tournaments against all teams in the opposing region.
 - 9.2.3 Once all the teams have completed their league schedule, 6-8 teams from each division will qualify for the SCCVL League Championships.
 - 9.2.3.1 See section 2.1 for more details about league championship format.
- 9.3 An indoor season schedule for the Work Up/Down Format consist of:
 - 9.3.1 3 weekends of pool play and a crossover match.
 - 9.3.2 Once all the teams have completed their league schedule, 18 teams from each division will qualify for the SCCVL League Championships.
 - 9.3.2.1 See section 2.1 for more details about league championship format.

- 9.3 The CBVT season consists of:
 - 9.3.1 4 Fall tournaments
 - 9.3.2 1-2 Spring tournament(s)
- 9.4 The SCCVL Indoor League Championships will be played in March or April.
 - 9.4.1 See Section 2.1 for more details.
- 9.5 The CBVT Championships will be played in November.
 - 9.5.1 See Section 4 for more details.
- 9.6 If a team does not attend a Regional, Crossover, or Pool Play tournament, the following protocol will take place.
 - 9.6.1 A monetary fine of \$500 for missing the tournament.
 - 9.6.2 Receive a 0-2 forfeit loss for every match not played, while the teams in attendance receive a 2-0 win.
 - 9.6.3 The teams missing the tournament will not be eligible to make up their missed matches.
 - 9.6.4 In the event of 2 forfeits in any season, the violating team will be expelled from the league for the current season and may be eliminated from the league for a 2-year period.
 - 9.5.4.1 Being expelled from the league does not entitle the team to a refund of their league fee.
 - 9.6.5 Ineligibility for the SCCVL Championships and other SCCVL events.
 - 9.6.6 Probationary status the following year with the possibility of expulsion from the league for further infractions.
 - 9.6.7 The League Commissioners shall take any other action when deemed necessary.
- 9.7 If a team does not attend a CBVT event after they have registered without informing the tournament director, the following protocol will take place.
 - 9.7.1 The team shall not receive a refund on their tournament entry fee.
 - 9.7.2 The team may not be eligible to participate in the next beach tour stop.
 - 9.7.3 If multiple infractions occur, permanent denial from tournament entry will be put in place.

ELIGIBILITY

- 10.1 For all SCCVL events, the 10-05-2025 NCVF Governance Rules are in full effect.
- 10.2 Highlights of those rules and modifications are detailed below.
 - 10.2.1 Minimum Unit Rule
 - 10.2.1.1 An undergraduate player appearing on a team's roster must be enrolled in a minimum of 9 units (or ¾ of full enrollment) at the school he/she wants to play for.
 - 10.2.1.2 Graduating Senior Exception A graduating senior is any player graduating within the current quarter/semester of certification. A graduating senior may carry any number of units required to graduate. A separate letter for each graduating senior from the Registrar/Admissions Office is required.
 - 10.2.1.3 A graduate student appearing on a team's roster must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 units at the school he/she wants to play for.
 - 10.2.1.4 6-Year Consecutive Rule Each player has 6 consecutive years of eligibility to participate on his/her team. Year 1 begins the first time an individual's name appears on a team's club or varsity roster.
 - 10.2.1.5 Current Varsity Rule Current year varsity players are not eligible to participate as roster members of an otherwise SCCVL eligible team.

- 10.2.1.5.1 A "Current Year Varsity Player" is defined as any player listed on a school's varsity volleyball team roster during the same academic year as the SCCVL Championships.
- 10.2.1.6 Former Varsity Rule A team may have 2 "former varsity" volleyball players on its roster.
 10.2.1.6.1 A "Former Varsity Player" is defined as any player listed on a school's varsity volleyball roster during any academic year other than the academic year of the SCCVL Championships.
 - 10.2.1.6.1.1 "Varsity" refers to a school's varsity indoor volleyball program, including, but not limited to, a program whose team competes in an intercollegiate sports governing body like the NGAA, NJGAA, NAIA, CCCAA, NWAACC, etc. in the sport of indoor volleyball. Players from Varsity programs other than NCAA or NAIA programs will not count toward the 2 Former Varsity Player limitation. *Updated as of 11/27/2023*.
- 10.2.2 Any team using ineligible players shall forfeit all matches in which that player participated.
- 10.2.2.1 Any team and/or individual will be fined. The fine will be based on the amount of matches played with ineligible players and the expenses for the day of the tournament(s).
- 10.2.3 The remaining matches will count for official standings, but the violating team will be ineligible for the SCCVL Championships.
- 10.2.4 The violating team will be on probationary status the following year and will be subject to expulsion from the league upon further violation.
- 10.2.5 A team returning to the league after being removed for disciplinary reasons must serve a 2-year probationary period, unless waived by the respective League Commissioner.
- 10.2.6 All new teams must serve a 2-year probationary period and play its first season in Division 2 or 3, unless waived by the respective League Commissioner.
- 10.3 All SCCVL rosters will be used for all Triple Crown Series events hosted by the SCCVL.
- 10.3.1 Teams may not make changes or move athletes around their roster for Triple Crown Series events, as the TCS will utilize roster verification from the NCVF to ensure accurate rankings and results will be submitted.

LEAGUE ADMISSION DEADLINES & FEES

- 11.1 All previous members of the league must refile for admission each year by the time the annual league-scheduling meeting is held.
- 11.2 The league scheduling meeting shall be in October. The League Commissioner will announce the site and time.
 - 11.2.1 Each team must be represented at this meeting.
 - 11.2.2 Each team must have scheduling information to facilitate scheduling of all required home matches.
 - 11.2.3 Each team shall:
 - 11.2.4 Inform the League Commissioner who will represent it and provide that person's contact information.
 - 11.2.4.1 Meet league entrance fees and officiating responsibilities.
 - 11.2.4.2 Schedule home matches to fulfill the league schedule.
 - 11.2.4.3 Provide the name, telephone number, and e-mail address of the team representative(s) as well as the coach if applicable.

- 11.2.4.4 Provide its Sport Club Director's name, phone number, fax number, and e-mail address. This information must be kept current should any changes occur.
- 11.3 Indoor League entry fees must be paid on or before January 15, 2026 or a late fee of \$350 per team will be imposed. Failure to pay by January 15, 2026 may eliminate that team from membership in the league for the current academic year.
- 11.4 CBVT entry fees must be paid by the deadline set in place based on the tournament date.

LEAGUE FEES

- 12.1 The indoor entry fee for admission to the league will be \$1,750 per team.
- 12.2 The league entry fee does include the NCVF's \$50 membership fee. It is highly recommended that all teams play at the NCVF National Championships and utilize the NCVF membership benefits.
- 12.3 The CBVT entry fees will vary based on the criteria below.
 - 12.3.1 There will be a one time CBVT League annual Membership Fee for each program of \$1,000.

 12.3.1.1 An annual membership will provide admin support, beach permits, referees, awards at the CBVT championships, CBVT t-shirts at CBVT Championships, online scoring and recording keeping, and other annual benefits per competitive season.
 - 12.3.2 An individual can sign up for an Open tournament, for \$60 per pair.
 - 12.3.3 There is a strict no refund policy in place for all CBVT events.
- 12.4 The entry fees will be used to cover administrative costs, the league webpage, all-league and league awards, officials at the SCCVL League Tournaments and Championships, as well as travel and other costs associated with attending NCVF meetings.
- 12.5 Any additional expenses, which the league may wish to cover, will be levied only with the approval of the league commissioner.
- 12.6 For the indoor league, a \$500 non-refundable payment will be due on November 30, 2025. The remaining balance of the league fee will be due on January 15, 2026.
- 12.6.1 If a team would like to pay their league fee in full on or before November 30, 2025, they may elect to do so.

TEAM RESPONSIBILITIES

- 13.1 Below are the responsibilities teams must meet to be an active member of the SCCVL:
 - 13.1.1 It is the responsibility of the home team to obtain and pay for officials for all non-league matches if they so choose to do so.
 - 13.1.1.1 If the home team decides not to pay an official for the match, they are responsible for assigning a ref who is knowledgeable in the game of volleyball, knows the updated rules and regulations as listed by USA Volleyball, and is unbiased towards the home team.
 - 13.1.2 Each team must file with the League Commissioner the following documents to substantiate each player's participating status:
 - 13.1.2.1 Signed constitution by the team president, which is in representation for the entire team.
 - 13.1.2.2 Signed liability forms by every participant in the SCCVL.
 - 13.1.2.3 Paid, in full, SCCVL league entry fee.
 - 13.1.2.4 Failure to comply with the deadlines in this section will result in a \$350 late fee.

- 13.1.2.5 Each team representative must see to it that the proper forms and fees are sent in by the stated deadlines.
- 13.1.2.6 Each team must be represented at league meetings.
- 13.1.2.7 Match obligations for the home team (grounds for forfeiture) are as follows:
 - 13.1.2.7.1 2 approved volleyballs.
 - 13.1.2.7.2 1 scoreboard operator (records final set scores) and 2 line judges.
 - 13.1.2.7.3 Visible scoreboard.
 - 13.1.2.7.4 Score-sheets.

MISCELLANEOUS

- 14.1 A cumulative schedule will be compiled by the league office and made available online to each team via the webpage for further confirmation.
- 14.2 Changes in and additions to the schedule should be kept to a minimum.
- 14.3 Notification of changes must be phoned immediately and then e-mailed to the League Commissioners.

NEW TEAMS
